DENVER COLD WEATHER/EMERGENCY SHELTER PROCEDURES

As part of the Cold Weather and Emergency Operations Plan for 2010-2011, Denver Department of Human Services (DDHS) and Denver's Road Home (DRH) will partner with the Salvation Army, The Delores Project and Urban Peak to oversee cold weather/emergency shelter operations for homeless men, women, youth and families. **Only on nights when cold weather conditions are expected and all other local homeless shelters and community partners have filled their regular and overflow beds**, Denver will open additional overflow shelters at the Salvation Army (Crossroads), The Delores Project, Urban Peak and a local church when necessary. People in need of shelter should call Mile High United Way's 2-1-1 for shelter and resource information.
